



Marking a scorecard correctly

When recording scores, the gross score of the player named on the card should be noted in column A. If you have swapped cards, then your gross score should be noted in the markers column.

Gross score of player named on card goes in Column A

Net score of player named on card goes in this Column

If you are marking a card, your gross score/stableford points goes in the Marker col.

Stableford points of player named on card goes here

Sign the card in the appropriate place

Total all columns before handing in the card

The net score of the player named on the card should be noted in the Nett Score column. For information, net score is the score on each hole after taking into account the player's handicap. If you are marking a card, you can add then points you scored on each hole next to your gross score in the Marker's column separating the two numbers by a stroke or dash ie 5/2 or 5-2.

If it is a stableford competition, then the points scored on each hole should be recorded in the final column.

If you are unsure about stableford scoring then this may help:

- If net score is 1 over par, 1 point
- If net score equals par, 2 points
- If net is 1 under par, 3 points
- If net score is 2 under par, 4 points
-and so on

Please total all columns and, after checking the card with your marker, both the player and the marker should sign the card.
